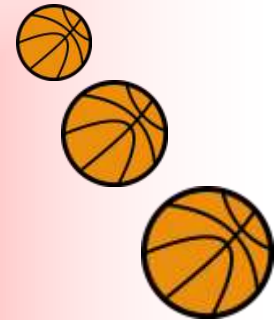

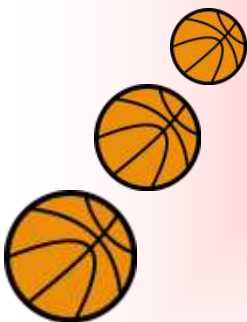

RATES NOTICES 2015/16

Council has adopted the annual Shire Plan and Budget for the 2015/ 16 Financial Year.

Council has resolved to increase the Land Rate on the Unimproved Capital Value of properties across the Shire by 4.0%. The minimum Rate on properties has also been increased by 4% for the 2015/16 year. The increase is in line with the long term strategy developed in 2012/13.

There is very little scope within the budget to provide funds for improvement works throughout the Council area. There has been a slight reduction in the level of service for cleaning of the community facilities.

Notices were issued in late August with the due date being the last Friday of September (25th September 2015).

Amounts outstanding after the due day will be charged 20% per annum, calculated on a daily basis.

All landowners should be aware that Council has resolved to strictly enforce the provisions of the Local Government Act which allows Council to request the Lands Title Office to register the Charge over the land unless suitable repayment arrangements are entered into.

The Registration of the Charge will apply to any property with a debt greater than 6 months and debtors have not made proper arrangements to satisfactory repayments.

The registration of the Charge effectively places a caveat over the land. This restricts the ability of the land being used as collateral when applying for loans through financial institutions. There is also an additional cost to the landowner to remove the registration of the Charge.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Residents and land owners should be aware that they have a responsibility to ensure Council has the correct mailing address for Rates Notices at all times. The maximum penalty for not updating Council with the correct address is 20 Penalty Points (currently \$3000).

Council originally obtains its contact information from the Lands Title Office. Again there is a responsibility on the landowner to keep this address up to date as owners may miss important information. The legislation states that a notice is served if it is sent to the last known address of the property owner. This is either the address Council has on its registers or the Lands Title Office has for the property owner.

Please contact the Council if you have changed your address or have not received your rates notice.

ANTICIPATED TRAFFIC DELAYS CHINNER RD

Residents and travellers in the Lake Bennett area should be aware of possible traffic delays along Chinner Road in October and November this year. The delays will be due to traffic control plans being put in place to ensure a safe work place whilst heavy patching and remediation work is being carried out on the road. Most delays should be less than 5 minutes, however there may be circumstances where delays may be longer.

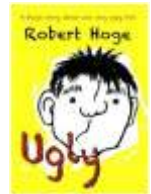
ADELAIDE RIVER LIBRARY

Council's Complaints Process

If you choose to raise concerns to (or compliment) Council you are requested to write to the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) outlining the details. There are two (2) forms on the Coomalie Council website <http://www.coomalie.nt.gov.au/> under Forms and Services; one is for complaints about dogs (Dog Complaint Letter) and the other is for general complaints (General Complaint Letter).

On receipt of your concern/issue the CEO will provide a report on the matter to Council at the next Council meeting and respond to you as directed by Council.

Dogs in the Coomalie Shire

All dogs within the Coomalie Region over 3 months of age must be registered.
You can register your dog at the Coomalie Council Office.

Dogs must be on a leash at all times in any public area otherwise they will be impounded.

Fees apply if your dog has been put in the pound.

Impoundment fees are initially \$90.00 for registered dogs, \$165.00 for unregistered dogs then \$60.00 per day while kept in Pound. Registered dogs are kept for 3 days and unregistered dogs are kept for 2 days.

Unregistered dogs must be registered before being released from the pound.

Town Dogs - A limit of 2 dogs per household applies

Entire Dog \$40.00

Sterilised Dog \$11.00

Concessions 1/2 price

Rural Dogs - Registration is free and no limits apply

BATCHELOR MUSEUM UPDATE - OCTOBER 2015

Along with an obvious reduction in tourists, our visitor numbers have fallen a lot in this past month. For now we are continuing to open each day though this is difficult with so few volunteers. Great thanks are due to Denise Grecian-Wright for managing the situation and for doing many of the hours. Also thanks to Vick, who has continued to be there for Mondays.

Our booked tour company is still bringing people through several times a week, and additionally Denise conducted a group through the Museum for another tour company last Sunday. The group included interstate school teachers looking at places to bring school groups in the future. Hopefully there will be a response!

A replica album of photographs was added to the Rum Jungle collection-Kim Creed, who now lives in Canada, sent in an album of coloured pictures of the mine and country and they have scanned well.

Slowly display additions are happening for the other areas too and there will be quite a lot of expansion ready for the new season in 2016. Meantime there will also be lots to do maintenance wise. The external doors and a few areas in Block A need touch up painting.

We were devastated that someone chose to slash trees and plants overnight recently. One tree, carefully nurtured for several years to provide future shade, has died. The other small tree has so far persisted and will hopefully recover. The Mango and Tamarind trees and pot plants have withstood the damage.

The small number of people who care for the Museum are very committed and would be happy to introduce others to know and experience this community asset-it is a very rewarding activity, and many people who visit are delighted to talk with locals.

The Museum has proved to be a destination and a focus for persons who want to connect with their parents or relatives who served during WW2 in this area. I mentioned the doctor who had been at MRS1 last month-now there is a lady whose Mother served at the hospital at Adelaide River coming to talk with me in a few weeks.

It has been timely to gather the information from the mining era before it is lost and also for WW2 as this year of remembrance emphasises.



DONATIONS to BATCHELOR MUSEUM

Whilst the Batchelor Museum is primarily an interpretive one, we have been given some wonderful display items. When you visit you will see the name on the object and the person who has donated it- some of the notices are yet to be done.

Items must be given permanently to the Museum and there is a form which we will have available- the format given to us from the Military Museum in Darwin, please be aware this is a common policy of museums.

Be proud of the Museum – it will showcase the unique town of Batchelor and will be a valuable resource to bring visitors from all over.


