# COOMALIE COUNCIL CHAMBERS

#### 2016/17 RATES

Rate Notices were issued in late August with the due date being the last Friday of September (30 September 2016).

Amounts outstanding after the due date will be charged 20% per annum, calculated on a daily basis.

All landowners should be aware that Council has resolved to strictly enforce the provisions of the Local Government Act which allows Council to request the Lands Title Office to register the charge over the land unless suitable repayment arrangements are entered into.

Council has decided to strictly enforce the provisions of the Local Government Act. All properties with an outstanding balance at the end of March 2017 will have a Statutory Charge imposed. This is a legal process which results in the property not being able to be sold or used as collateral for a loan. The additional charges associated with the imposition of a statutory Charge are added to the current outstanding amount.

## **CHANGE OF ADDRESS**

Residents and land owners should be aware that they have a responsibility to ensure Council has the correct mailing address for notices at all times. The maximum penalty for not updating Council with the correct address is 20 Penalty Points (currently over \$3000).

Council originally obtains its contact information from the Lands Title Office. Again there is a responsibility on the landowner to keep this address up to date as owners may miss important information. The legislation states that a notice is served if it is sent to the last known address of the property owner. This is either the address Council has on its registers or the Lands Title Office has for the property owner.

Please contact the Council if you have changed your postal address or have not received your rates notice.

## **RUBBISH COLLECTION**

Residents who have a weekly domestic garbage collection service are reminded that the Council Contractor is required to only pick up one 240L bin per week. The Contractor is not required to pick up additional bins or waste placed next to the bin. Additional bins and additional waste is the responsibility of the owner.

Residents can purchase a second bin at the cost of the service or purchase an appropriate bin from Council at cost, currently \$110.

#### SEALING MILTON RD

An opportunity arose in September to apply for another Department of Transport grant. Council has now been allocated a further grant of \$1,412,224 to continue the sealing of Milton Road. Council is expected to contribute \$416,790 to the project. These opportunities do not come along very often.

Council should amend the existing Roads Forward Works Program to allow the grant for the Department of Transport and Infrastructure to be incorporated and that Council accept the Grant. At the completion of the work there will be only about 8 km left to sealed between Batchelor and Adelaide River

#### BATCHELOR LANDFILL OPENING HOURS TO BE LIMITED

Council is introducing limited opening hours for the Batchelor Landfill. This has been forced on Council by scavengers risking their safety at the landfill.

The Batchelor Landfill is now closed on Wednesdays and Thursdays as stage two of rationalising the operation of the tip.

Contractors have commenced manning the Land fill. They will be onsite for approximately 20 hours per week. Supervisors will be inspecting loads, and directing traffic.

Opening hours will be further limited to approximately 20 hours per week as trends emerge. This is expected to be introduced in mid-April.

All residents are reminded to dispose of waste responsibly.

#### **COUNCIL ELECTIONS**

The next election for Councillors will be held at the end of August. Nominally the date is the 26<sup>th</sup> August 2017. It is however likely that the voting process will be similar to the recent Northern Territory Elections and voting will not necessarily be on the day. It looks likely that there will be a polling place in Adelaide river on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> August for two hours and in Batchelor for two hours on Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> August 2017.

It is probable that the polling place in Adelaide River will be the Adelaide River school and the Council Chambers in Batchelor.

Eligible voters may apply for a postal vote online prior to the election. This will then be forwarded in the mail to the voter. Voters may also pre vote Darwin, Palmerston, Katherine and Alice Springs in the two weeks leading up to Election Day.

Nominations to become a Councillors will occur in early July.

# Community Grants 2017-18

## **GENERAL**

Competitive Grants are available for Community Groups based in the Council area in the following areas:

Operational costs

Renewal and Improvement Projects

**Events** 

The total pool this year is will be determined by Council when it considers the 2017/18 Budget. Council has allocated \$8000 for each of the last two years. The most grants do not exceed \$1500. The maximum grant available is \$5000.

All grants must be acquitted by 30 June 2018.

Council may award an alternative amount then the amount requested. This will be subject to the Community Group making up any shortfall.

Grants will be paid after evidence has been supplied that the project or project component has been completed.

Applications must make reference to the appropriate goal, objective or action within the Council Shire Plan.

Unincorporated groups may need to be sponsored by an auspicing body such as an incorporated body. However Council will consider projects from groups of residents interested in a community project. In this case the auspicing body will be the CCGC





# **Council's Complaints Process**

If you choose to raise concerns to (or compliment) Council you are requested to write to the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) outlining the details. There are two (2) forms on the Coomalie Council website <a href="http://www.coomalie.nt.gov.au/">http://www.coomalie.nt.gov.au/</a> under Forms and Services; one is for complaints about dogs (Dog Complaint Letter) and the other is for general complaints (General Complaint Letter).



# Dogs in the Coomalie Shire

All dogs within the Coomalie Region over 3 months of age must be registered. You can register your dog at the Coomalie Council Office in Batchelor or Adelaide River or via email.

Dogs must be on a leash at all times in any public area otherwise they will be impounded. Fees apply if your dog has been put in the pound.

Impoundment fees are initially \$90.00 for registered dogs and \$165.00 for unregistered dogs, then \$60.00 per day kept in Pound. Registered dogs are kept for 3 days and unregistered dogs kept for 2 days.

Unregistered dogs must be registered before being released from the pound.

#### BATCHELOR MUSEUM UPDATE - MARCH 2017

OPEN! The Museum had a thorough spring clean over three days so it was ready for display over the period when visitors are around Darwin for the 75<sup>th</sup> commemoration of the Bombing of Darwin. Many thanks to Denise who organised the days, and to our volunteers- Sue, Carol, Amy, Sean, Paul, James. Then we are all manning the Museum on roster until Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> February. The café has also been open on those days.

After such a massive effort we will keep opening weekends so that there is opportunity for locals and early-season tourists to attend. I have developed some new panels and also had formal signs made for some display objects, as well as moving some so that they display better.

I was in Darwin Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> for the Bombing of Darwin ceremony, and it was bigger, better than ever-some visitors remarked to me at Adelaide River next day how wonderful it was when the Veterans laying wreaths were clapped, and people stood to acknowledge them.

The Adelaide River service went well, and visitors appreciated the opportunity to visit the beautiful but sobering cemetery. There were three busloads of visiting WWII people driven from Darwin as well as others in their own vehicles, plus a number of locals. The local school children came and brought round cups of cold water which was appreciated. It was obvious from the three events that I attended how many people were in family groups; adult children supporting parents, and some bringing young children.

We have endeavoured to promote the Museum through NT Tourism, City of Darwin and Tourism Top End, but there were people I spoke to who hadn't any information. I handed brochures about Batchelor Museum (and my own WWII camp) to people on the buses to read and hand around. Some are staying longer than the set activities so may well visit the Museum in coming days.

The third activity I attended was a talk from Peter Forrest about a postal worker, Arthur Wellington and his last letter to his wife and child, written at 1.30am on February 19, 1942. The baby had been born in a very old Darwin Hospital, and was present at the talk-as was another lady who also was born at that same hospital-relevant pictures had been located and were shown by Sheila Forrest.

"That is so" I responded to a query in an ABC interview on Monday 20th, asking about the comment that there is not enough notice given to places outside Darwin which were bombed and also played a significant role in WWII. A great opportunity to talk about the unique role of Batchelor and surrounds. An insight can be achieved by visiting the WWII section of our Museum-take the opportunity.
